


First, how favorable or unfavorable is your opinion of the Chappaqua Central School District?






QUALITY OF EDUCATION

How would you rate the quality of education provided by the Chappaqua Central School District?



<u>high quality of education</u> provided by the Chappaqua Central School District.


LOCAL SCHOOL TAXES

Looking ahead, over the next five years do you expect your local school taxes to:





Which is closest to your view?




We should invest about the same in teaching as comparable districts.

We should invest less in teaching than comparable districts because Chappaqua will always attract strong teachers, regardless.


PROPERTY VALUES AND PUBLIC SCHOOLS

To what extent do you agree that <u>property values in the community</u> will fall if the quality of the public school system declines in the future?




ADMINISTRATORS PER STUDENT





The current busing situation is adequate. We should continue to maintain the walking distances adopted by Chappagua Schools and invest as needed to maintain the present quality.
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
