- Half-day afternoon professional development sessions with teachers


What did a day at Writers Camp look like?

- Small group instruction and collaboration
- Time for students to write independently while teachers conferred with individuals and met with small groups
- Celebration with parents on last day, including a 30 minute parent workshop with Shelley
- Published an anthology of student work





Value for Students

- Built enthusiasm about writing
- Built a community of writers
- Allowed focused time for writing each day
- Provided targeted individual instruction and skill development
- Provided opportunities for peer and adult feedback
