#### Dear Board Members:

In a conversation this week with Board Vice-President Victoria Tipp, I agreed to send to you this Proposal Letter for a Superintendent Search as a means of outlining the typical way in which we assist boards of education in undertaking this the most primary of their responsibilities. It is important to note, however, that each search is customized to meet the unique needs of the district. I would be happy to meet with you if you wished any additional information.

#### Fees and Expenses:

As discussed with Ms. Tipp, the actual replacement date would depend upon the Board's ultimate determination as to the length of any interim superintendent period.
