Guidelines & Expectations for All Students

Elementary, Middle and High School Learners will...

- respect every member of our school community for who they are as people, and show this respect at all times (whether you are in school, in our community, or on social media).
- demonstrate an understanding of the seriousness of the pandemic by following all school procedures designed to keep everyone safe and make smart decisions while not in school to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- wear a mask at all times while inside our buildings and on our buses (unless given permission to briefly remove your face covering by an adult for lunch, snack, or a break).
- wash hands with soap and water and/or use hand sanitizer throughout the day.
- give each other space by maintaining your social distance while walking the halls, using the bus, entering the building and classrooms, etc.
- stay home if you feel sick and have your parents will communicate with our school nurse.
- charge your device every night so you are ready for the next day.
- have patience with your teachers and each other if we need to rely on a blended or fully remote learning model.
- make sure you take all of your belongings home each night (in case we need to move to remote instruction the next morning).
- let your parents, your teacher or a trusted adult know if you are struggling, because we are all here to help you.

Guidelines & Expectations for Students Learning Remotely

All Virtual Learners will...

- present themselves as they would for in-person instruction and use a space that reflects the classroom (ex. the student is dressed for school and not lying in bed).
- work in a private location, without outside interference from other people and/or animals (unless assistance is required to access instruction by our elementary students).
- **come prepared** with necessary materials to actively participate in both synchronous and asynchronous learning experiences.
- **follow the daily schedule** as outlined by the classroom teacher and log in through Zoom, Google Classroom and/or Canvas at the start of each synchronous learning experience.
- communicate with your teacher to ask for support if issues arise during class.
- be visually present during the class at the beginning of class for attendance purposes (students who do not have their camera on during class or small group discussions may be removed from the class if this is an expectation of the teacher).
- actively participate in the lesson by asking questions, collaborating with classmates and sharing ideas.
- complete and submit classroom assignments as instructed by the classroom teacher.
